	4. Therefore, I am praying the IITH authorities for informing me the shortlisting criteria in equivalent percentage of marks for Ph.D admission in AI.	Shortlisting criteria is 86 cumulative marks percentage (or equivalently 9.1 CGPA) for GEN/OBC (Creamy layer) candidates.  Conversion formula followed: Percentage = (10 x CGPA) – 5.  The candidate Mr. Yarrapatruni Venkata Sai Bharadwaj provided CGPA of 8.82 in his application, which is below the shortlisting criteria.

## **Grounds of the appeal:**

Provided Incomplete, Misleading or False Information

#### **Appeal Text:**

Respected Sir,

It is painful to submit to you that CPIO is not following SOP (Standard Operating Procedures).

Here is my humble submission, Sir.

CGPA and grading system are different for different Institutes. Even the scaling is different. For example, some Institutes follow on a 4-point scale, while others follow on a 10-point scale.

It is; therefore, the originating Institute will give the conversion chart and also a certificate.

The Central University of Hyderabad had issued me a conversion certificate which is attached herewith.

It is, therefore, humbly requested to inform me the list of candidates selected for Ph.D programme, their CGPA and the Equivalent percentage of marks as per the conversion formula given by that Institute.

# **Disposal of Appeal:**

# More detailed description of Al PhD shortlisting criteria:

Shortlisting criteria/cutoff is 86 cumulative marks percentage, or equivalently 9.1 CGPA on scale of 10, for GEN/OBC (Creamy layer) candidates, depending on what is provided at the time of application.

Conversion formula followed in the cutoff: Percentage =  $(10 \times CGPA) - 5$  (or equivalently) CGPA = percentage/10 + 0.5

- \* For a candidate application with CGPA on a 10-point scale, this is used as is with the CGPA cutoff
- \* For a candidate application with cumulative percentage marks, this is used as is with the percentage cutoff
- \* For a candidate application with GPA, but not on a 10-point scale, it is converted to scale of 10 as CGPA = CGPA On Scale K\*10/(K), and then used with the CGPA cutoff. (E.g., if K=4, i.e., a 4.0-point scale, CGPA = CGPAOnScale4\*10/4)

The candidate Mr. Yarrapatruni Venkata Sai Bharadwaj's application provided CGPA of 8.82 on a 10-point scale, which is below the shortlisting criteria provided above.

Questions asked in the RTI application and Appeal cannot be different. Any additional information requested beyond the original requested information in this RTI application cannot be entertained.
